I have been an employee of the NSAC for over 25 years and am now completely disappointed in the proposed merger bill put forth by your government. This bill does not protect my earned rights as a civil servant. The bill has been hastily constructed and is an extremely poorly written piece of work! I urge you not only to delay its rapid pushing through the legislature but to demand it be properly reviewed and to settle all items relating to preserving the pension, Long term service awards, sick leave, vacation etc. Employees have repeatedly been told by our employer that our privileges will be preserved and accounted for and yet this bill does no such thing!
