Dear Honourable Premier Tim Houston & Honourable Minister Brad Johns,

Today, I had an opportunity to present to the Standing Committee on Law Amendments. The focus of my presentation was related to the Office of Children and Youth in Nova Scotia.

I commend the government for taking action on this matter and presenting a solution within the Financial Measures Act.

I'm sending this email to summarize the proposed amendments I shared with the committee today:

- 1. The Governor-In-Council should be able to appoint multiple commissioners, not just one (for example: ANS Land Titles Initiative, 3 Commissioners).
- 2. The appointed commissioners should fall within the age range of youth using the Canadian age-defining youth (15-34).
- 3. Commissioners should not be required to be government employees but, instead, professional contractors so they can continue to pursue their professional careers.
- 4. The office shouldn't just conduct investigations related to children's services (reactive). The office must pursue opportunities for youth engagement/ empowerment (proactive).
