As a Nova Scotian I value democracy and the democratic process. Your government has introduced legislation that has nothing to do with the platform you ran on and the mandate you received from the public of Nova Scotia in the most recent provincial election. I want to add my voice to the many Nova Scotians who are standing up and saying "NO " for Nova Scotia.

- " NO " to Bill 1
- " NO " to Bill 6
- " NO" to Bill 12

I would request that you withdraw these Bills completely.

The government wants to repeal their own legislation on the province's fixed election date, give it the power to fire the auditor general for no cause, which they have now walked back on to a degree, but still want to restrict the auditor general's work. This is not a correct course of action. The Auditor General is a backstop of the government. They also want increase politician's pay.
